




Summer Reading Programs


Age range: Preschool to grade 4.

Plant a Seed

Explore the world with Acorn and his wild outlook, until he hits a hard place and has to adjust his speed. Through this book we will introduce the diversity of seeds and how they get a round and into the ground.

Program includes a collection of seeds to explore. Compare them and then design your own seed for travel using one of the four methods available: air, water, animals, or ejection.
